
Shri Ram Janmabhoomi | tourist attractions in ayodhya | ayodhya famous place

With intricate carvings and gold-plated images of Ram-Sita, Kanak Bhawan is thus one of the pleasant places to visit in Ayodhya.

Saryu River Ghats: Peace Along the Holy Waters

The holy Saryu River, indeed, is not only another place of religious significance but also a soothing site for contemplation and prayer. Evening aartis take place at Naya Ghat and Ram Ki Paidi, drawing a good number of devotees and the locals. These ghats are the quietest Ayodhya tourist spots that provide a spiritual experience soothing for the mind and soul.

Treta Ke Thakur is a little-known tourist spot but major in Ayodhya. This is believed to have been the place where the Ashwamedha Yagya was conducted by Lord Ram. The idols made of black stone are said to be ancient and depict Ram, Lakshman, Sita, Bharat, and Shatrughan - all carved from a single slab of black stone. It remains a secret for connoisseurs of history and worshippers.

Nageshwarnath Temple is one which occupies pride of place amongst all the tourist places in Ayodhya. This temple was founded by Kush, the son of Lord Ram, according to local folklore. This is indeed a blessed temple of Lord Shiva that comes alive as the people celebrate Shivratri.

Other Attractions

Ram Katha Park: A cultural auditorium where devotional play and music are staged.

Tulsi Smarak Bhawan: Shrine of poet Tulsidas, who wrote the Ramcharitmanas.

Mani Parbat and Sugriv Parbat: Small hillocks associated with the Ramayana that overlook the city and are an exciting place to visit in Ayodhya.
